## New Book Targets God Seekers

Does God seem distant? Does the Bible seem too hard to understand?

**TAMPA, Fla.** -- It began when a melody came into her mind as she was reading Psalm 18, on December 18, in the aftermath of the September 11 terrorist attacks.

Cheryl Rogers noticed, with interest, the similarities between our nation's struggles and King David's. So she penned the melody to what became her first song, "*My High Tower.*"

It was the anniversary of her father's death, and he had always encouraged his two daughters to write songs. But Rogers had never been inspired before.

"It's something I never thought I would do, or *could* do," says 52-year-old Rogers, a former newspaper reporter who has been a stay-at-home mom the last several years.

As the months went by, she continued to be inspired as she read Scriptures, but the songs sat on a shelf in her Tampa home until two years later. She believed God led her to sing one of them, "I Will Give Thanks to You," in her church talent show.

Her intent was to declare her healing -- in faith -- from a goiter, a growth on her thyroid.

"It was like the floodgates opened. God gave me more and more songs, enough for an album and then some," Rogers explained, "and they kept coming."

She believes God wants her to share the songs via the Internet with music ministers throughout the world.

Rogers' first CD is entitled *Victory!* because God " '**giveth us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ..'** " *1 Corinthians 15: 57,*" she said.

It contains 13 original songs derived from the King James version of the Bible, but modernized and adapted to the melodies. The songs are in a variety of styles including melodic, Celtic, country, and traditional.

She also has produced two more Scripture song CDs: *Arise Shine*, an 11-song melodic collection, and *Bring my Soul out of Prison*, an 11-song country collection.

The website features free Scripture art, a regular blog and podcast, and a Christian Gift Mall.
